Chilmark, MA, 02535 ?

SEVEN MILES off the shore of Cape Cod in Massachusetts, Martha's Vineyard is a roughly triangular-shaped, 96-square-mile Atlantic Ocean island with six towns. One of these communities is Chilmark, whose 02535 ZIP Code has the priciest residential real estate in all of New England, according to Realtor.com. (News Corp, owner of The Wall Street Journal, also operates Realtor.com under license from the National Association of Realtors.) Rural and private, Chilmark has a pastoral landscape: rolling hills, stone walls and sheep grazing on hillsides. It also encompasses the small working fishing village of Menemsha, which has a public beach where people congregate to watch spectacular sunsets across Vineyard Sound.

NOTABLE STOPS AND SHOPS Chilmark General Store

Housed in a building from 1900, this one-stop shop sells household basics and local produce, with a special emphasis on meats, cheeses, and charcuterie—not to mention freshly baked baguettes. It also has a takeout counter (try the pizza). People like to meet on the porch for eats and conversation.

The Chilmark Tavern is a popular upscale dining spot even though the town is dry.

Chilmark Tavern

One of Chilmark's only upscale restaurants is a tavern, an irony because Chilmark is the only dry town on Martha's Vineyard. That doesn't deter diners from coming to this popular bistro-style dinner spot. House classics include fish and chips, poulet frites, and steak.

Larsen's Fish Market

Located in Menemsha, this family-

Menemsha Blues

This family-run clothing store was founded in 1994. There are two shops on Martha's Vineyard, but the original is in Menemsha. The namesake label features casual seaside wear such as polos, sweatshirts, and caps that sport the company's fish logo.

SOCIAL CENTER OF GRAVITY

The Chilmark Community Center is an informal family hub in the summer, with activities that in-

clude children's camps, fitness classes, tennis, sailing and movie nights. Offseason, it is home to preschool classes, town meetings and social gatherings.

EVENT OF THE YEAR

An ode to the island's rich literary heritage, the Martha's Vineyard Book Festival alternates years with the Martha's Vineyard Author Series, both of which take place during the summer at Chilmark Community Center, among other locations on the island.
